

WORKING IN THE UK?

Then you might want to know. Or someone you know might want to know:

RIGHTS

As a worker, you are entitled to:

- Fair and equal treatment
- A written contract
- Be paid the minimum wage
- A wage slip
- Have only what is legal and fair deducted from pay
- Safe working conditions
- Safe accommodation
- Paid holidays

If some of these are missing from your list, your employer may be exploiting you.

WRONGS

Have you:

- Been forced to work against your will?
- Not been paid for your work the agreed amount?
- Had your identification documents taken away?
- Been treated badly by your employer or agent?
- Been deceived or misled?
- Been threatened?
- Been under constant control?

If this is happening to you, you may be in forced labour. **Forced labour is a crime.**
